

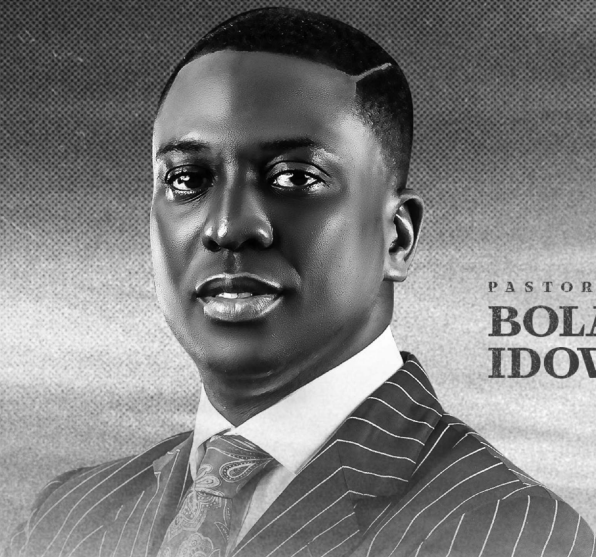

- 1. Start your letter with THANKSGIVING and an AFFIRMATION of how good and kind your GOD is.**
Example: "Dear Allan, it is amazing that GOD has shown you his kindness, love and favour so much that everything I do works"
- 2. Acknowledge what God has done in your life before now.**
Example 1: "It is amazing that against all odds, last year, I got married and I got pregnant".
Example 2: "I made my first 300 dollars where our annual turnover is now 1 million dollars".
- 3. Write your clear outcomes.**
Instead of saying "Father, bless me..." say, "Father, I thank you for helping me expand my business to a level where our annual turnover is 200 million naira".
Example: "I thank you for the approval of my immigration papers use".
- 4. Don't forget you are writing in the language of faith!**
Father, I thank you for it was such an outburst of joy when the doctor came with a positive result that I was carrying my baby. I shouted, I screamed and indeed, I was happy!
Express your emotions and put yourself on a memory map as if it has been done. Imagine it happening!
