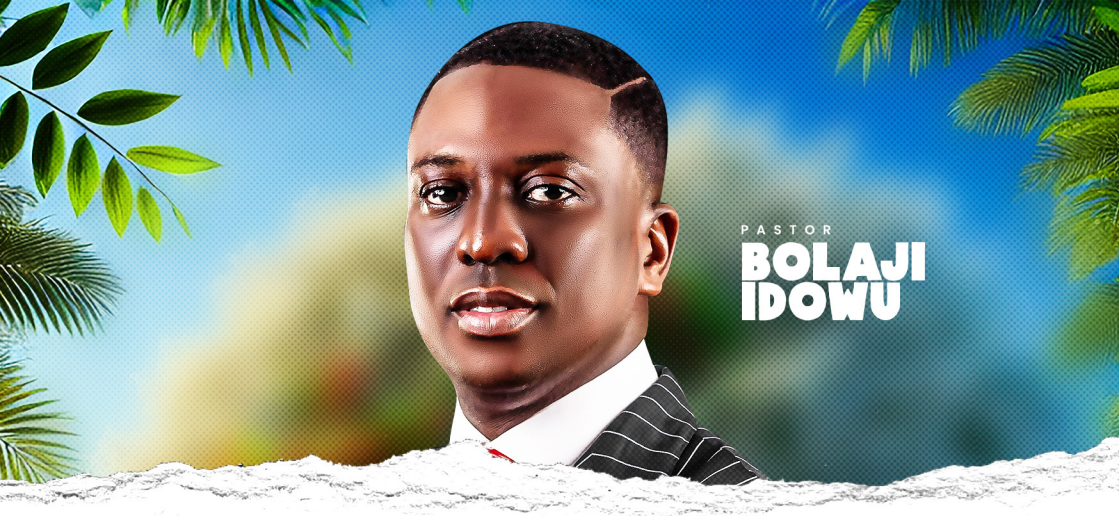

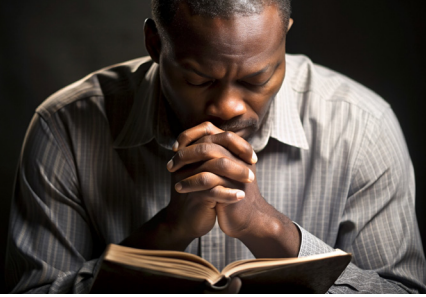

HOW FAITH COMES

“So then Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.”
Romans 10:17 (KJV)

Faith is the foundation of our relationship with God. When we heard the gospel and became born again, we were given faith as part of the fruits of the Spirit. Therefore, we are all capable of living a life of faith. But you can't function in it if you don't know it's there or have enough knowledge on how to wield it.

Scriptures say that without faith, it is impossible to please God (Heb 11:6). It is through Faith that we believe in His promises, experience His presence, and receive His blessings. How then does Faith come into our lives?

The Bible tells us that faith comes by hearing the word of God. The knowledge of how Faith works is hidden for you and not from you in the scriptures. HOW CAN YOU APPLY YOUR FAITH?

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MAKING YOUR FAITH WORK

Thus also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.
James 2:17 (KJV)

Faith is not just about believing in God. It is about putting that belief into action.

The Bible teaches that faith without works is dead, meaning that our faith must be demonstrated through our actions.

Heb 11:1 defines faith as the substance of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen. The confidence and hope gotten from the promised word of God as revealed to you should be demonstrated through your actions.

HOW TO MAKE YOUR FAITH WORK:

1. MOVING BEYOND BELIEF: Your faith works when your actions align with your belief. James 2:17-26

2. THE POWER OF SPOKEN WORDS: Speaking positive words can bring our desires into reality. Proverbs 18:21 this means that the words we speak can either build up or tear down. Mark 11:24

3. TRUSTING IN GOD'S PROMISES: Trusting God means trusting in His character as well as His promises. Proverbs 3:5-6 Hold unto the truth of God's word without weaving or doubting what he has promised. Hebrews 10:23/Hebrews 11:6

4. BOLDLY STEPPING OUT: It can be scary to step out of our comfort zones and take a leap of faith, but remember God is always with you every step of the way. James 2:17-18

It is important to remember that our works are not a means to earn salvation but a natural response to the faith we have in Christ. Our good deeds are an expression of the love and grace we have received from God.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Making your faith work means using your faith to help others and make a difference in the world. Just like how our bodies need exercise to stay strong, our faith needs action to grow

stronger!

HOW CAN YOU MAKE YOUR FAITH WORK?

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MAXIMISING FAITH

I tell you the truth, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you." Matthew 17:20

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Psalm 55:17 (NIV): "Evening, morning and noon I cry out in distress, and He hears my voice.

Ephesians 6:18 (NIV): "With all prayer and petition pray at all times in the Spirit, being watchful to stay awake as you can about it with regard to yourselves, your loved ones, and all godly leaders and believers."

Prayer is a powerful tool given to us by God Himself, which we use to communicate our needs, fears, joys, and praises directly to Him. When we pray, we align ourselves with God's will, seeking His guidance and wisdom. Prayer fosters a deep and personal relationship with our heavenly Father, with the power to change hearts, heal relationships, and transform lives, a lifeline to His divine presence.

In the Bible, we see countless examples of the power of prayer. When Hannah poured out her heart to God, He answered her prayer and gave her a son, Samuel. When King Hezekiah prayed for deliverance from the Assyrian army, God sent an angel who defeated the enemy. Jesus himself emphasised the importance of prayer. He also taught his disciples the Lord's Prayer, a model for how we should pray.

HERE ARE SOME OF THE WAYS THAT PRAYER HELPS US AS CHRISTIANS:

1. PRAYER DEEPENS OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD (James 4:8)

Prayer is an intimate communication with God. It allows us to express our thoughts, fears, and desires directly to Him. As we draw near to God through prayer, we experience His presence more profoundly, building a deeper, more personal relationship. HOW CAN YOU USE THE POWER OF PRAYER?

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THE POWER OF SPIRITUAL ENCOUNTERS (MOSES)

Exodus 3:4-6 (NIV): 'When the Lord saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the Bush, 'Moses! Moses! 'And Moses said, 'Here I am.' 'Do not come any closer,' God said, 'Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy ground.' Then he said, 'I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.' At this, Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God.'

Spiritual encounters make God or a dimension of God real to us. One of the most profound examples of such an encounter is found in the story of Moses. Having had doubts and fears, Moses' meeting with God in the burning bush marked a pivotal moment in his life and in the history of Israel. This encounter set the stage for Moses' leadership role and the liberation of the Israelites from Egyptian bondage. The first platform that grants a man access to work with God is a true encounter that doesn't just leave you with memories but with a conviction that produces faith, faith that can move mountains.

Moses' encounter with God in the burning bush was not just a vision; it was a call to action. Despite his initial fear and hesitation, Moses responded to God's call, stepping forward in obedience despite the unknown. This encounter transformed Moses from a shepherd into a leader, equipped with the authority to confront Pharaoh and lead the Israelites out of slavery. Like Moses, these transformative encounters are better personal and to be desired, so that one knows God for themselves.

Spiritual Encounters can be through the word, visions, supernatural experiences, prophetic encounters, amongst others.

Transformative Encounters give you stamina (Proverbs 24:10), make you consistent (Job 13:15), and produce convictions (John 4:7-30).

Moses teaches us several valuable lessons about spiritual encounters. Such as:

- **OBEDIENCE:** Moses obeyed God's call, even though it seemed impossible and risky. His willingness to follow God's instructions, regardless of the circumstances, is a model for us.
- **HUMILITY:** Recognizing the holiness of the ground under his feet, Moses removed his sandals. This act of humility reminds us that our encounters with God should be approached with reverence and awe.

• **COURAGE:** Facing the unknown and the challenges ahead, Moses stepped forward in faith. His courage inspires us to trust God in our own spiritual journeys.

In conclusion, as we continue our journey through the studying of the scriptures, let us remember that God seeks to meet with us, too, calling us into deeper personal relationships and service. Let us desire and be open to these encounters, ready to hear His voice and follow wherever He leads.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

HOW CAN YOU EXPERIENCE THE MIRACULOUS?

1. Ask God for miracles: Believe that God can do amazing things and ask Him for help.

2. Trust God's power: Remember that God is all-powerful and can do anything.

3. Look for miracles: Keep your eyes open for amazing things happening around you.

4. Thank God for miracles: When you see a miracle, thank God and tell others about it.

Remember, experiencing the miraculous is like having a front-row seat to God's amazing show! Keep your eyes open and your heart ready to see what God will do!

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, I praise You for Your mighty works and for the miracles You perform in my life and in the world around me.

Thank You for revealing Yourself through these extraordinary acts, confirming Your word and demonstrating Your unfailing love to me.

Father, I pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit in my lives and in our churches, let the miraculous be a part of our daily experience.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- Have you experienced any supernatural events that you just couldn't explain?
- How did you respond?



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IDENTIFYING AND EMBRACING YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFTS

Corinthians 12:27-28 KJV: Now ye are the body of Christ, and members in particular. And God hath set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, governments, diversities of tongues.

There are at least 22 spiritual gifts mentioned in scriptures. Each believer is uniquely equipped with at least one spiritual gift, and it is the Holy Spirit that determines who receives which gift. These gifts empower us to serve others and glorify God. Identifying your spiritual gifts is essential for fulfilling your purpose and living a life of impact. However, we can cultivate any spiritual gift we earnestly desire (1Cor 14:1). But then, having an understanding of the various spiritual gifts first is important in your journey to identifying and embracing your own spiritual gift(s).

HOW TO IDENTIFY SPIRITUAL GIFT:

- **PRAY ABOUT IT:** Ask God to show you what your spiritual gift is. He created you and your gifts therefore He knows you best. Thank Him for the privilege to be a blessing to others and ask that He makes you sensitive to your gifts.
- **STUDY THE WORD OF GOD:** Read and study all you can about the different spiritual gifts. Ask God to show you examples of gifts that are similar to yours in the Bible.
- **IDENTIFY AREAS OF MINISTRY THAT YOU ARE PASSIONATE ABOUT:** Holy Spirit can plant seeds of interest in areas He has called you into. People perceive and react differently to situations based on their gifts.
- **CONFIRMATION FROM OTHERS:** Prayerfully ask believers around you, friends, spouse, leaders in church or people who know you well enough. God can use someone around you to confirm what He has been telling you, because sometimes, they can see in you what you can't see for yourself.

Embracing your spiritual gifts requires stepping out of your comfort zone and willingly serving others. When you offer your gifts to God, you are not only blessing others but also growing in grace and maturity.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Spiritual gifts are special abilities or talents that God gives us to help others and build His kingdom.

HOW CAN YOU IDENTIFY AND EMBRACE YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFTS?

1. **ASK GOD TO SHOW YOU:** Pray and ask God to reveal your spiritual gifts to you.
2. **TRY NEW THINGS:** Experiment with different activities, like helping others or leading a group, to see what you're good at.
3. **ASK OTHERS:** Ask parents, teachers, or friends what they think you're good at.

7. **THANK GOD FOR YOUR GIFTS:** Remember that your gifts come from God and thank Him for them.
8. **SHARE YOUR GIFTS WITH OTHERS:** Tell others about your gifts and how you're using them to help others.

PRAYER

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SHARPENING YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFTS

APPLICATION:

To sharpen your spiritual gifts, consider the following steps:

Philippians 4:13 "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

In the past two days we already learnt that as children of God, we are endowed with unique spiritual gifts that equip us to serve His kingdom effectively.

However, it's not uncommon to experience fears and doubts about these gifts. We may question our abilities, worry about being judged, or feel inadequate.

It's important to remember that our spiritual gifts are not based on our own strength or qualifications. They are graces freely given to us by the Holy Spirit to build up the body of Christ.

Apostle Paul reminds us in Philippians 4:13 that with Christ's strength, we can overcome any obstacle, including our fears and doubts.

“For I would have you know, brethren, that my gospel was not of man’s design.”
(Galatians 1:11)

God has graciously bestowed upon us spiritual gifts to equip us for the work of His kingdom. However, these gifts are not meant to be hoarded or used for personal gain. They are to be used profitably for the benefit of others and the glory of God.

The apostle Paul understood this principle well. He received his gospel message directly from God, not through human channels. This gave him the confidence to proclaim his message boldly, knowing that it was not his own but God’s.

APPLICATION:

- **TOTAL DEPENDENCE ON THE HOLY SPIRIT:** Ask the Holy Spirit to show you how to use your gifts effectively. Pray for wisdom and discernment to discern the appropriate time and place to use them.
- **SERVICE:** Use your gifts to bless and uplift those around you. Help others in need, teach, encourage, or use your creative abilities to give glory to God.
- **SEEK ACCOUNTABILITY:** Share your plans to use your spiritual gifts with trusted friends or mentors. They can provide encouragement and feedback to help you stay focused on using your abilities for the right reasons.
- **BE FAITHFUL:** Remember that your gifts are a trust from God. Use them diligently and consistently, without seeking recognition or praise.

Remember: Your spiritual gifts are not just for you but for the entire body of Christ. Use them to make a positive impact on the world around you, and let God’s glory shine through you.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Your spiritual gift is a special talent that can bring joy and help others. When you use your gift to help others, it’s called making

it “profitable”. You’re using your gift to make a positive impact.

HOW CAN YOU MAKE YOUR SPIRITUAL GIFT PROFITABLE?

- 1. IDENTIFY YOUR GIFT’S VALUE:** Think about how your gift can help others. Can you draw pictures for sick kids in the hospital? Can you sing at events to make people happy?
- 2. FIND OPPORTUNITIES TO SHARE YOUR GIFTS:** Look for chances to use your gift, like school events, local contests, or even online platforms.
- 3. SET A GOAL AND WORK TOWARDS IT:** Set a goal and use your gift to achieve it!

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DEVELOPING CONSCIOUSNESS OF GOD'S PRESENCE

Psalms 16:8 NLT, "I know the Lord is always with me. I will not be shaken, for he is right beside me"

Developing a keen awareness of God's presence is very essential in our spiritual journey. This consciousness isn't just about recognizing God's existence; it's about living in a state of constant communion with Him, where every moment is an opportunity to encounter His love, wisdom, and guidance. Our anchor scripture speaks to the intentionality with which David maintained an awareness of God's presence. He didn't just acknowledge God's existence, but he actively kept the Lord at the forefront of his mind.

Jesus himself modeled this consciousness of the Father's presence. In John 8:29, He declares, "The one who sent me is with me. He has not left me alone, for I always do the things that are pleasing to him." Jesus lived each moment in awareness of the Father's nearness, and this empowered Him to fulfill His divine purpose.

Cultivating this spiritual habit does not happen overnight. It requires intentional, daily effort to turn our thoughts to God and remember that He is with us. This may involve setting reminders, memorizing key Scriptures, or pausing throughout the day to refocus our minds on His presence.

HOW TO CULTIVATE A CONSCIOUSNESS OF GOD'S PRESENCE

- **PRAYER:** Regular, intentional prayer helps to establish a dialogue with God, fostering a sense of His closeness. Even brief moments of prayer throughout the day can reinforce the reality of His presence.
- **SCRIPTURE READING:** Immersing oneself in the Word of God helps to understand His nature and His desire to be present with His people. Meditating on scripture can deepen the awareness of His presence.
- **STILLNESS AND SILENCE:** Taking time each day to sit quietly, either alone or in a group, can create space for God to speak to your heart. This stillness can become a sacred time of

- **WORSHIP:** Participating in corporate worship or simply singing songs of praise can shift your focus from the mundane to the eternal, reminding you of God's omnipresence.

Living consciously in God's presence means approaching every moment with openness to His guidance and grace. It means choosing to trust in His plan, even when circumstances seem uncertain. It involves finding joy in the ordinary, seeing every task as an opportunity to glorify Him.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

God is always with us, like a best friend who never leaves our side!

Developing the consciousness of God's presence means being aware of Him all the time. It's like having a special radar that helps us feel God's love and guidance.

HOW TO CULTIVATE A CONSCIOUSNESS OF GOD'S PRESENCE

- 1. TALK TO GOD:** Share your thoughts, feelings, and adventures with God throughout the day.
- 2. LOSTEN FOR GOD'S WHISPER:** Pay attention to gentle thoughts or feelings that might be God's way of guiding you.
- 3. LOOK FOR GOD'S SIGNS:** Notice beautiful things in nature, kind acts from others, or answered prayers – these can be reminders of God's presence.
- 4. TAKE DEEP BREATHS:** Breathe in deeply and imagine God's love filling your heart.
- 5. BE STILL:** Take quiet moments to focus on God's presence, like during prayer or before bed. Remember, developing the consciousness of God's presence is like nurturing a special friendship – it grows stronger with practice and attention!

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, help me to cultivate a deep consciousness of Your presence in my everyday life.

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THE ABC OF EFFECTIVE BIBLE STUDY

2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NIV): "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."

As believers, developing a consistent and meaningful Bible study habit is crucial for spiritual growth and maturity. However, many Christians struggle to approach the Scriptures in a way that truly transforms their lives. The good news is that there is a simple, yet powerful, framework we can use to make our Bible study more effective.

A - APPROACH WITH REVERENCE

The Bible is the inspired, inerrant Word of God. As we open its pages, we must approach with a deep sense of reverence and humility, recognizing that we are encountering the very words of the Almighty. Psalm 119:18 reminds us to "Open my eyes that I may see wonderful things in your law." With this attitude, we position ourselves to receive life-changing insights from the Lord.

B - BUILD CONTEXT

It's easy to take a verse out of context and miss the full meaning. That's why it's crucial to read each passage within its historical, cultural and literary context. As we examine the surrounding verses, the original audience, and the author's intent, the Scriptures come alive in new and profound ways. This deeper understanding equips us to apply the truth accurately to our own lives.

C - CONNECT TO CHRIST

At the heart of the Bible is the person and work of Jesus Christ. Whether we're studying the Old or New Testament, our ultimate aim should be to see how the passage points to or reveals something about our Savior. As we make these Christ-centered connections, our love and appreciation for Him grows, and we are transformed by the power of the gospel. When we approach the Bible with reverence, build proper context, and connect the text to Christ, our study becomes truly transformative. We move beyond mere intellectual knowledge to experiencing the living, active Word of God. Our hearts are stirred, our minds are renewed, and our lives are aligned with God's purposes.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

A - APPROACH WITH REVERENCE

The Bible is God's special book, so we approach it with reverence, which means showing respect, care and attention. We can do this by preparing our hearts, handling the Bible with care, finding a quiet spot to study, reading with purpose, and asking for guidance.

B - BUILD CONTEXT

This means understanding the situation and background of the Bible passage you're reading. It's like knowing the setting and characters of a movie to understand the plot.

We can do this by knowing who wrote the passage, when it was written, where it happened, who was involved, and what the main idea is.

C - CONNECT TO CHRIST

This means seeing how Jesus Christ is related to the Bible passage. We can do this by looking for Jesus, understanding His role, reflecting on His love, and asking for His help.

Remember, effective Bible study is like being a detective. You search, discover, and apply God's truth to your life.

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, help me to approach Your Word with humility, recognizing it as the breath of Your divine inspiration. Father, help me to be intentional in my study, seeking not only to understand but to be transformed by Your teachings. Stir my hearts with curiosity, that I might delight in discovering the depths of Your wisdom and love revealed in Your Word. Amen.

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ENJOYING PRAYER AND COMMUNION WITH GOD

Psalms 34:8 (NIV): "Taste and see that the LORD is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him."

Prayer is not just about talking to God; it's about enjoying His company. When we approach God in prayer, we are invited into a space of intimacy and joy. This joy comes from knowing that we are heard, valued, and loved by the Creator of the universe. It's a joy that transcends our circumstances and fills our hearts with peace and contentment.

The Bible paints a picture of prayer as a sweet time of fellowship and intimacy with our Heavenly Father. In Psalm 16:11, David declares, "Because of you, I know the path of life, as I taste the fullness of joy in your presence. At your right side I experience divine pleasures forevermore!" This speaks to the profound joy and delight that can be found in God's presence.

HOW TO DEEPEN YOUR COMMUNION WITH GOD

Deepening our communion with God involves more than just saying prayers; it's about cultivating a lifestyle of worship and obedience. This includes:

- **SPEND TIME IN HIS PRESENCE:** Make prayer a regular part of your day, not just a task to check off a list. Spend time in silence, listening for His voice and communing with Him.
- **READ AND REFLECT ON HIS WORD:** Engaging with the Bible helps us understand God's heart and His desires for us. Reflecting on what we read can deepen our appreciation for His wisdom and love.

CONFESSION

"I am a person of faith, my faith is shown in my every action. I am empowered to live out the principles of God's Word daily. I do not get weary in doing good, even when it is challenging. I know that my labour in the Lord is not in vain."

HOW TO ENJOY COMMUNION WITH GOD

- 1. TALK TO GOD:** Share your thoughts, feelings, and adventures with Him.
- 2. LISTEN FOR GOD'S WHISPER:** Pay attention to gentle thoughts or feelings that might be God's response.
- 3. BE HONEST AND OPEN:** Share your joys and struggles with God.
- 4. TAKE TIME TO ENJOY HIS PRESENCE:** Sit quietly, breathe deeply, and feel God's love.

EXAMPLE:

- Before bed, say, "God, thank you for today. I'm sorry for [mistake]. Please help me [need]."
- During the day, whisper, "God, I'm feeling happy/sad. Please be with me."
- Take a few minutes to sit quietly, close your eyes, and feel God's love surrounding you.

Remember, enjoying prayer and communion with God is like having a special playdate with your best friend – it's fun and makes you feel happy and loved!

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- What are some ways you can demonstrate your faith through actions?
- How do your actions reflect your faith in Christ?



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THE POWER OF SERVICE, SACRIFICE, HONOR AND GIVING

Philippians 2:5-8: Think of yourselves the way Christ Jesus thought of himself. He had equal status with God but didn't think so much of himself that he had to cling to the advantages of that status no matter what. Not at all. When the time came, he set aside the privileges of deity and took on the status of a slave, became human! Having become human, he stayed human. It was an incredibly humbling process. He didn't claim special privileges. Instead, he lived a selfless, obedient life and then died a selfless, obedient death—and the worst kind of death at that—a crucifixion.

Service, sacrifice, honor, and giving are not just actions; they are expressions of love and obedience to God. They reflect our willingness to lay down our own interests for the sake of others and for the glory of God. As followers of Christ, we are called to a life of service, sacrifice, honor and generous giving. These qualities reflect the very nature of our Savior, who "did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:28)

Throughout the Scriptures, we see powerful examples of those who embraced this call. In the Old Testament, we read of Moses, who sacrificed his position in Pharaoh's household to lead the Israelites out of slavery. In the New Testament, the apostle Paul modeled a life of tireless service, enduring hardship, persecution and even imprisonment for the sake of the gospel.

Perhaps the greatest example is Jesus himself, who "made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant." (Philippians 2:7) He willingly laid down His divine privileges, humbled Himself, and ultimately gave His life on the cross so that we might be saved.

When we honor God through our service and sacrifice, He in turn honors us. Jesus promised that "whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave." (Matthew 20:26-27) Those who humble themselves will be exalted.

So, let us embrace the call to a life of service, sacrifice, honor and giving. As we pour ourselves out for the sake of the gospel, may we experience the profound joy and power that comes from walking in the footsteps of our Savior.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Service is helping others with a happy heart.
Sacrifice is giving up something valuable for the benefit of

another. Honor is showing respect and kindness to others.
Giving is sharing what you have with others.

HOW CAN YOU SERVE, SACRIFICE, HONOUR, AND GIVE?

- 1. SERVE OTHERS:** Help family members, friends, or those in need.
- 2. SACRIFICE FOR OTHERS:** Give up a toy, time, or treat for someone else's benefit.
- 3. HONOUR OTHERS:** Use kind words, listen, and show respect.
- 4. GIVE GENEROUSLY:** Share toys, books, or time with others.

Remember, the power of service, sacrifice, honour, and giving is like being a superhero – it makes a difference in the lives of others and brings joy to your heart!

PRAYER

Heavenly Father, I thank You for the example of Jesus, who modeled service, sacrifice, honor, and giving His life.

Help me to live lives that reflect these virtues, not for my own gain but for the glory of Your name.

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BREAKING NEGATIVE PATTERNS

For I delight in the law of God, in my inner being. But I see in my members another law warring against the law of my mind and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin that dwells in my members." (Romans 7:22-23)

Negative patterns can become ingrained in our lives like stubborn weeds that choke the growth of our spiritual well-being. They can hinder us from experiencing the fullness of God's love and purpose. But, like any habit, negative patterns can be broken with persistence and God's grace.

The first step is to identify the negative pattern that we want to overcome. This could be a tendency to complain, a habit of procrastination, or an unhealthy addiction. Once we recognise the pattern, we can begin to understand its triggers and the deeper reasons behind it.

Next, we need to seek God's help. The Holy Spirit convicts us of sin and empowers us to change. Prayer and reading the Bible are essential tools for spiritual transformation. God's Word reveals the truth about who we are and who He created us to be.

Breaking negative patterns also requires practical steps. This could involve setting boundaries, seeking support from others, or engaging in activities that bring us joy and fulfilment. It is important to be patient and persistent in these efforts. Change takes time and will likely involve setbacks along the way.

However, when we persevere, God's grace will sustain us. He will give us the strength to confront our weaknesses and overcome negative habits. As we break these patterns, we will experience greater freedom and joy in our lives.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

God is not happy with us when our behavior does not follow the good pattern of Jesus! But the amazing thing is that he is willing to help us, because he knows us and knows our limitations and weaknesses.

PRAYER

Dear Lord, I acknowledge the negative patterns that have held me captive. I ask for Your help in identifying them and understanding their source. Empower me with Your Holy Spirit and give me the strength to break free from them. Help me to walk in the Spirit and live a life that is pleasing to You. Amen.

HOW CAN YOU BREAK NEGATIVE PATTERNS?

- **DEPEND ON GOD:** Remember always that you have a loving God and you do not have to do life on your own. So depend on God to help you destroy the negative habits so you can look more like Jesus.
- **STUDY YOUR BIBLE:** Your Bible is your manual and it helps you to know how to act at all times. Spend time reading the Bible and doing all you have read in your everyday life.
- **IDENTIFY YOUR TRIGGERS:** Your triggers can be anything. It could be certain friends, books or movies. Identify what makes you act badly and take the bold step to get rid of them.
- **PRAY:** When you pray you talk to God. When you talk to God, he corrects and guides you. So always pray so you can hear God's correction and you can change your ways.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- What negative patterns have you been able to recognize and identify in your life?
- What practical steps are you intentionally putting in place to combat these negative patterns?



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WHAT TO DO WHEN THERE IS A DELAY

But the Lord is faithful, he will strengthen you and protect you from the evil one."
(2 Thessalonians 3:3)

In the dynamic web of existence, we sometimes encounter seasons of waiting and delay. Our plans may be disrupted, our dreams put on hold, and our expectations unfulfilled. Such times can be trying to our faith and patience.

When faced with delay, it's tempting to become discouraged, anxious, or even angry. However, the Bible offers us guidance and encouragement on how to navigate these challenging situations.

1. SEEK GOD'S WILL AND TIMING: Instead of dwelling on the delay, turn to God in prayer. Ask for His wisdom and understanding. Trust that His timing is perfect, even when we do not comprehend it. (Isaiah 55:8-9)

2. STAY FOCUSED ON CHRIST: Keep your eyes fixed on Jesus. Remember His faithfulness and the hope He offers. Let His presence comfort you and guide you through the uncertainty. (Hebrews 12:2-3)

3. PRACTICE PATIENCE: Waiting can be difficult, but it's an opportunity to develop patience and endurance. Trust that God is working behind the scenes, even though you may not see it. (James 1:2-4)

4. BE ACTIVE IN GOD'S KINGDOM: While you wait, don't become idle. Engage in activities that serve others and bring glory to God. This will keep your mind focused and help you grow in faith. (Matthew 5:16)

5. SURROUND YOURSELF WITH SUPPORT: Connect with other believers who can encourage and support you during this time. Share your struggles and celebrate the small joys along the way. (Proverbs 18:24)

6. TRUST IN GOD'S FAITHFULNESS: Remember that God is faithful to His promises. He will never abandon you or leave you alone. Trust that He will strengthen you and protect you from harm. (Psalm 91:4)

7. PRAY FOR DISCERNMENT: Ask God for discernment to recognise when the delay is for your benefit or when it's a sign to adjust your path. Seek His guidance to make wise decisions. (Proverbs 3:5-6)

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

There have been things we wanted and wished for that we couldn't get instantly. This is also the same in our relationship with God, when he promised us things and the Bible shows us ways to act when we have to wait for a promise to be fulfilled.

- TRUST GOD: Trust God when he says he will give you what you wish for because the Bible says that heaven and earth may pass away but God's word would always come to pass.

- TRUST THE WAITING PROCESS: It can be frustrating to wait, but in times when God makes us wait, there is something he wants us to learn. This process also entails that we understand that God's time is perfect and he makes things beautiful in his own precious time.

- PRAY: The Bible teaches us to ask for our heart desires in prayers and supplication and with thanksgiving

- TRUST IN GOD'S FAITHFULNESS: Remember all the times you prayed and God answered you and trust that this time won't be any different

PRAYER

Dear Lord,
Thank You for Your faithfulness. When I face delays, help me to seek Your will, trust in Your timing, and stay focused on You. Give me patience, endurance, and the courage to continue serving You in the midst of waiting. Surround me with Your presence and the support of Your people. Amen

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- Are you currently encountering a season of delay?
- What are the structures you have or can put in place to navigate such season?
- What habits are you learning and unlearning while in this season?



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RECEIVING FROM GOD

Give, and it will be given to you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over; for with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you."
(Luke 6:38)

One of the greatest joys of being a Christian is the privilege of receiving from God. Our heavenly Father is a bountiful provider who desires to bless us beyond our wildest dreams. However, receiving from God is not simply a passive act; it requires an active response on our part.

1. ASK: The first step to receiving from God is to ask. Jesus said, "Ask, and you will receive" (Matthew 7:7). When we humbly approach God with our needs, we open ourselves up to His provision.

2. BELIEVE: Once we have asked, we must believe that God is able and willing to meet our needs. Faith is essential for receiving from God, for "without faith it is impossible to please Him" (Hebrews 11:6).

3. RECEIVE: When we have asked and believed, we simply need to receive God's provision. This may not always be in the way we expect, but it will always be in accordance with His perfect will.

4. BE THANKFUL: Receiving from God is a wonderful gift that should not be taken for granted. Expressing our gratitude to God strengthens our faith and opens us up to even greater blessings.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

God loves us so much and wants to give us good things. Receiving from God means being open to getting His love, help, and blessings. Just like how you receive a gift from a friend or family member, you can receive from God too!

HOW CAN YOU RECEIVE FROM GOD?

- Talk to God and ask Him for what you need or want (like a friend would!).
- Listen to God's gentle voice in your heart (it might feel like a

happy or peaceful feeling).

- Be thankful and say "thank you" to God for what He gives you.
- Remember that God's gifts might not always look like what we expect, but they're always good! - Trust that God wants the best for you and will take care of you.

EXAMPLE:

- Ask God for help with a hard task or test, and then trust that He will guide you.
- If you're feeling sad or scared, ask God to give you comfort and peace.
- When something good happens, say "thank you" to God and celebrate His love!

Remember, receiving from God is like having a special friendship with Him!

PRAYER

Dear Lord, thank You for Your generous provision. I come before You today with an open heart, asking for Your blessings in every area of my life. I believe that You are able and willing to meet my needs, and I receive Your provision with gratitude. Amen.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- Do you believe that God is able and willing to provide for you?
- What's one thing you need God's help with today? for you?
- How can you be more thankful for the blessings you have already received?



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ENFORCING YOUR VICTORY

1 John 5:4 KJV For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith.

As believers, our victory is guaranteed because of the finished works and sacrifice of Jesus Christ. We constantly need to remind ourselves of this fact and continually enforce the victory that Christ earned for us at the cross of Calvary. However we can only live victoriously as believers when we learn to enforce our victories. And to do that, you need to know your authority as a believer.

The devil is walking around seeking whom he may devour but we have the authority to resist steadfastly, the devil and he will flee. (James 4:7). God has given us authority over the enemy (Luke 10:19)

Enforcing your victories and authority is a function of knowledge. How much of God's word do you know? The more u know about enforcing your victories the more faith you have to enforce it. your ignorance will limit your authority. You must be given to bible study, and allow the Holy Spirit Show you things (Hosea 4:6)

We can enforce our victory over the devil by standing on the finished work of Christ against him and his kingdom. The devil cannot withstand this when done in faith. Any person who wants to live a victorious life over the forces of darkness must believe in the finished works of Christ. (1Peter 1:18-19, Galatians 3:13)

Once you don't know your authority you won't be able to enforce it . An unexercised authority can make the devil hurt you .In other words, when we enforce our victories, we stop the influence of the devil, allow God to intervene,and also change outcomes.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

The Bible contains Gods promises to us and also the things that we inherit because we are his children.

The Bible tells us that we are more that conquerors; and so automatically when we give our life to Christ we must walk around knowing that nothing can harm us and even before we get to the battlefield we have already won.

But the devils know this and his plan is to make sure we do not know how powerful we are so that he can continue to cheat and oppress us.

The only way we can win the devil and walk in victory that we already have is by reading the Bible to know what God says about us and walk in it. That way, the devil will lose the battle forever.

PRAYER

2 Cor2:14
Heavenly Father, thank you for causing me to triumph over every orchestration of the enemy, making me victorious on every side.

CONFESSION

"I am born of God therefore I am an overcomer. My faith is active and alive, producing results in every aspect of my life and as a result of this I always win.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- What are those areas in your life that seem to big to conquer ?
- How do you intend on enforcing your victory in Christ Jesus on those areas?



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DAY 21

And consider the example that Jesus, the Anointed One, has set before us. Let his mindset become your motivation." Philippians 2:5 (TPT)

It has been an intriguing and transformative journey this past 21 days. With loads of testimonies, spiritual renewal and divine encounters. It feels just like going to the gym to get back to shape, and after cardio and weight lifting, you feel a step closer to fitness, however, what happens beyond your time in the gym will greatly impact your journey to fitness.

In the same light, we must carry on with these spiritual habits (Studying the word, Praying and waiting upon the Lord in a fast), with the communities and Godly bonds we have formed during this 21 days. Intimacy with Jesus isn't meant to be occasional but perpetual. He doesn't want you once in a while, He wants you always. This mindset must be a motivation to carry on. What happens tomorrow and the day after when there is no corporate reminder to study the word, or to pray by mid-day?

God doesn't want you relenting, He wants you progressing. So set new targets for yourself, dream bigger for God, become better for the kingdom and by doing this, we will continue to glow in the freshness we enjoy through intimacy with the Holy Spirit. The proof of consistency is seen in the days when you do not feel like yet you carry on because you understand the price that is to be paid for the prize that is to be received.

The question we must seek to answer is what next? This isn't designed to be the end of your journey, but the beginning of an experience with God. One where your mind is stayed on him, where you enjoy perfect peace, where you are able to consistently work by faith and produce outstanding results. It has been a great journey this past 21 days, but this isn't goodbye but see you again with greater testimonies.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Just like how you brush your teeth every day to keep them strong and healthy, we need to take care of our relationship with God every day to keep it strong.

PRAYER

Dear Lord, I receive the grace and courage to remain faithful and consistent beyond this 21 days. (Galatians 6:9)

CONFESSION

"I am consistent and dedicated with my fellowship with God. I will not regress but progress in my spiritual journey. I fix my eye on Jesus, who is my perfect example."

Being consistent with God means talking to Him, listening to Him, and following His ways every day, not just on Sundays or when we feel like it.

1. TALK TO GOD DAILY: Take a few minutes each day to pray, share your thoughts, and thank Him for your blessings.

2. READ GOD'S WORD: Read a Bible story or verse every day to learn more about God's love and ways.

3. DO A DAILY DEVOTION: Use a devotional book or app to help you stay on track and learn more about God.

4. WORSHIP AND PRAISE: Sing songs, draw pictures, or write poems to express your love and gratitude to God.

5. OBEY AND FOLLOW: Try your best to follow God's rules and do what He asks you to do, even when it's hard.

6. Find A BUDDY: Share your journey with a friend or family member and encourage each other to stay consistent.

Exodus 15:26 (NKJV) - “If you diligently heed the voice of the Lord your God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. For I am the Lord who heals you.”

Day 2:

Confession: ***“I trust in the Lord with all my heart, and I lean not on my understanding. He is my strength and my healer in times of weakness.”***

Proverbs 3:5-6 (NLT) - “Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. Seek His will in all you do, and He will show you which path to take.”

Day 3:

Confession: ***“I declare that I am fearfully and wonderfully made. God’s healing power is at work in every part of my body.”***

Psalms 139:14 (NKJV) - “I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; marvelous are Your works, and that my soul knows very well.”

Day 4:


