Scripture: James 4:8, Psalm 63:1, Jeremiah 29:13

Intimacy with God is one of the highest pursuits of a believer. Many know about God through sermons and stories, yet true transformation comes from knowing Him personally.

David overcame Goliath through intimacy developed in the secret place, confidence rooted in communion, not strength. Abraham walked closely with God, boldly interceding and accessing His heart.

Intimacy is more than information; it is experience. It is recognizing His voice, enjoying His presence, and following His leading. His presence becomes home, His voice our guide, and His heart our desire.

Yet we don't always feel close; life distracts, and we drift, but closeness is restored as we intentionally draw near through the Word, prayer, worship, and obedience. As we pursue Him, intimacy is rekindled, and the flame burns again.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

God loves being close to you. When you pray, sing, or read your Bible, you become His special friend. He is always near, and when you draw close to Him.

REFLECTION

Start your day with a short prayer asking God to fill your heart with passion for Him.

PRAYER

Lord, teach me to be persistent in prayer. Help me not to give up, even when I feel tired or discouraged. I believe that You hear me and that You are working things out for my good. Strengthen my faith and keep my heart connected to Yours as I pray. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

CONFESION

I am fully committed to drawing near to God; His presence surrounds me, His voice guides me, and my heart is fully aligned with His. Intimacy with Him is my daily reality and my greatest delight.



THE HOLY SPIRIT

Scripture: John 14:26

The Holy Spirit is the third Person of the Trinity, fully God, eternal, and equal with the Father and the Son. He is God's indwelling presence in the believer, the One who regenerates, sanctifies, teaches, guides, empowers, comforts, convicts, and transforms. Without Him, there is no true Christian life, no real growth, power, direction, or lasting change.

Jesus called Him "another Helper," meaning One exactly like Himself, gentle, loving, powerful, and ever-present. The Holy Spirit brings Jesus near, makes Scripture come alive, strengthens our weaknesses, leads us into purpose, comforts our hearts, and fuels our prayers and worship.

He is not a force or influence, but God Himself. He is a Person who thinks, speaks, leads, and feels. He guides your steps, renews your mind, shapes your character, and works transformation from the inside out.

Everything God accomplishes in the believer is by His Spirit.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

God gave us the Holy Spirit to help us every day. He teaches us, comforts us when we are sad, and shows us what is right. He is gentle and kind, and He lives inside everyone who loves Jesus.

REFLECTION

How deeply do you rely on the Holy Spirit in your daily life?

PRAYER

Holy Spirit, I welcome You today. Make your presence real to me this year. Teach me, guide me, and strengthen me. Help me hear Your voice, obey Your leading, and walk in Your power. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESION

I am filled with the Holy Spirit; He teaches me, guides me, strengthens me, and transforms me from the inside out, empowering me to walk in God's power, obey His leading, and experience His presence every day.



THE POWER OF OBEDIENCE

Scriptures: 1 Samuel 15:22, Luke 11:28

Obedience means willingly submitting to instruction or authority. Spiritually, obedience to God is yielding to His will, trusting His wisdom above our own, and living in alignment with His Word.

When we truly love God, obedience becomes a response, not a struggle. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart..." (Deut. 6:5). Love fuels obedience, and obedience positions us for God's move in and through our lives. It opens doors, releases grace, and displays God's nature to the world.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

When God says something in the Bible, we listen and do it because we love Him. Obedience brings blessings, and we make God happy when we choose to do what is right.

REFLECTION

God esteems obedience above activity. Sometimes the miracle you seek is on the other side of your yes. Don't just hear, do.

PRAYER

Lord, give me the grace to obey You fully and quickly. May my obedience bring You joy and glory. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSİON

I choose to obey God fully and immediately, trusting His wisdom above my own; my love for Him fuels my obedience, and I walk in alignment with His Word, opening doors for His blessings and favor in my life.



THE POWER OF PERSISTENT PRAYER

Scriptures: Matthew 7:7-8, Colossians 4:2, 1 Thessalonians 5:17

Persistent prayer means praying consistently, with faith and confidence, regardless of how long it takes for the answer to come.

Persistent prayer doesn't twist God's arm; it trains our hearts. It shapes our desires, strengthens our spirit, and draws us deeper into trust.

Sometimes answers come fast; other times God develops us through the waiting. Persistence proves faith, not feelings. It reminds us that God is listening even when we don't yet see results.

Think of a child learning to ride a bicycle. He or she falls the first time, but then tries again and keeps going. Eventually, they learn to ride confidently, not because it was easy, but because they refused to quit.

This is what persistent prayer looks like. We keep praying because we trust our Father's goodness, even when the answer takes time.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Talking to God makes you stronger. Even when something feels hard, don't stop praying. God is always listening.

REFLECTION

Persistent prayer doesn't force God to act; it forms us to trust Him deeply.

PRAYER

Father, help me remain faithful in prayer. Teach me to trust You even when answers take time. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSION

I am steadfast and persistent in prayer, trusting God completely; I pray consistently, with faith and confidence, knowing He hears me, strengthens me, and works all things for my good in His perfect timing.

THE BELIEVER'S AUTHORITY

Scriptures: Luke 10:19; Ephesians 6:10–11

Every believer has been given spiritual authority through Christ. Authority means delegated power, something given, not earned. When Jesus rose from the dead and was exalted by the Father, He received all authority in heaven and on earth, and He passed that authority to us as His body.

The believer's authority is not activated by feelings but by revelation, knowing who you are in Christ, understanding the truth of God's Word, and boldly exercising faith. Many believers pray for things God has already provided, instead of using their authority to enforce victory.

This authority empowers you to stand firm against the enemy, cast out demons, heal the sick, silence fear, overcome spiritual resistance, and enforce God's will in your life, family, and environment. When you speak God's Word with faith, heaven backs you.

Your authority is real, powerful, and already given.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

God has given you power through Jesus. When you pray, speak God's Word, or say No to fear, you are using the authority Jesus gave you.

REFLECTION

Authority becomes effective when it is understood and actively used. Am I living as a believer who knows and walks in the power Christ has already given me, or as someone waiting for what is already mine?

PRAYER

Father, thank You for giving me authority through Jesus. Help me understand it, walk in it, and use it boldly to enforce Your will in my life. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESION

I walk in the authority of Jesus Christ; I boldly enforce God's will, overcome every enemy, speak His Word with faith, and operate in the power and victory already given to me as a believer.



PRACTICING GRATITUDE

Scriptures: Psalm 34:1, 1 Thessalonians 5:18, 2 Chronicles 20:21–22

Gratitude is more than saying thank you; it is a posture of the heart. Praise is not just a response to what God has done; it is a spiritual weapon that opens doors, shifts atmospheres, and prepares the ground for victory. When you choose gratitude in the storm, you declare:

“God, You are greater than what I feel.”

When King Jehoshaphat faced overwhelming armies, he didn't sharpen swords; he raised worship. Singers led the battle, not soldiers, and as praise rose, God Himself stepped into the fight. Gratitude invites God into situations where fear once ruled.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

When we thank God, even for the little things, He fills our hearts with joy and peace. Gratitude strengthens us and draws us closer to Him. So, let's thank God for our family, food, toys, friends, and all the love He gives.

REFLECTION

What can you thank God for today, not just for what He's done, but for who He is? Write three things you are grateful for and let gratitude shape your atmosphere.

PRAYER

Father, thank you for your goodness. Teach me to praise even when life feels heavy. Let gratitude rise within me daily. In Jesus name. Amen.

CONFESSON

I live a life of gratitude; I continually praise God for who He is and what He has done, knowing that my thankful heart shifts atmospheres, invites His presence, and positions me for victory in every situation.



DAY 7

THE STRENGTH OF SURRENDER

Scriptures: Luke 22:42, Proverbs 3:5-6

Surrender isn't always easy, especially when life feels uncertain, heavy, or beyond our control. Yet surrender is most powerful when it is hardest to give. It is in these moments that God does His deepest work within us.

Many see surrender as weakness, but in God's Kingdom, it is strength, courage, and faith.

To surrender to God is to release our grip and trust His timing, His wisdom, and His ways above our own. It means exchanging our will for His, not with fear, but with confidence that His plans are better.

Jesus Himself modelled surrender in Gethsemane: "Not my will, but Yours be done."

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Surrender means telling God, 'I trust You.' Sometimes we want our own way and things, but God's way is always better. When we give our worries and plans to Him, He will help us, guide us, and give us peace.

REFLECTION

Surrender isn't losing, it is letting God win. What do you need to release today? Your plan, your timeline, your fear? Place it in His hands.

PRAYER

Father, I lay down my plans, desires, and expectations at Your feet. Teach me to trust Your wisdom above my own. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSİON

I surrender my will, plans, and fears to God; I trust His wisdom, timing, and ways above my own, knowing that in surrender I find strength, peace, and victory.



WHAT FAITH IS

Scriptures: Hebrews 11:1; Romans 4:20–21

Faith is not a feeling that comes and goes. It is a spiritual certainty rooted in the unchanging Word of God. It holds on when answers seem distant and stands firm even when circumstances contradict what God has spoken. Faith does not wait to see before it believes; it believes and then expects to see.

Abraham did not waver when the promise looked impossible; he grew strong in faith, giving glory to God. That is what faith does: it praises while waiting, it obeys without full details, and it remains confident because God is trustworthy. True faith is a lifestyle, steady, unwavering, and anchored in God's faithfulness, not in visible outcomes.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Faith means believing God even when we can't see what He is doing. Faith says, 'God will help me,' even before the answer comes.

REFLECTION

Where in my life am I still leaning on what I see rather than what God has said? What action of faith can I take today as a sign of trust?

PRAYER

Lord, strengthen my faith and help me trust You completely. Teach me to believe Your Word above my feelings and circumstances. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSION

I walk by faith and not by sight. My faith is alive, growing, and producing results.

I trust God boldly, and I stand firmly on His promises.



DAY
9



HIS WORD, OUR CONFESSION

Scripture: Hebrews 10:23

There are three kinds of confession in Scripture: confessing Christ as Lord, confessing our sins, and confessing God's Word. Today, we focus on the third: speaking the Word of God.

Many believers are defeated not because God is silent, but because their words contradict what He has spoken. When we speak what God says, we enforce His will in our lives.

What You Must Know About Your Words

God's Word defeats wrong thoughts: You don't fight negative thoughts with silence; speak the Word.

Your words shape your life: Change your confession, change your future.

PRAYER

Lord, put Your Word in my heart and on my lips. Help me speak what You have said, not what I feel or fear. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSIO

I speak God's Word over my life; my words align with His promises, defeating every negative thought, shaping my future, and enforcing His will in my health, family, and destiny.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Our words are powerful, we should always say what God has said about us, e.g God loves me, God is with me, and 'I am strong.'

REFLECTION

What have I been saying about my life, health, family, or future? Do my words agree with God's promises or with my fears?



BEHOLDING THE MIRROR

Scriptures: James 1:23–25; 2 Corinthians 3:18

The Word of God is not just a book; it is a mirror. It reveals who we truly are in Christ and shows us what we are becoming. Every time we look into scripture, our identity becomes clearer, and our vision stretches beyond human limits into divine possibility.

Transformation is not instant; it is progressive. Day by day, as we behold the Word, we are shaped, refined, and renewed until our attitudes, choices, and character reflect Christ.

We become what we behold. If we behold fear, we reflect fear. If we behold the Word, we reflect Christ.

Let the mirror of the Word define you more than feelings, experiences, or external voices. Look into it, stay with it, and be transformed by it.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

The Bible shows us who we really are, that is, we are strong, loved, and special to God. When we read the bible, we start to think and act like Jesus. Just like a mirror shows your face, God's Word shows you who you are in Christ.

REFLECTION

Which truth from God's Word do I need to hold in front of my heart, my mind, and my mouth this week?

PRAYER

Lord, open my eyes to see myself through the mirror of Your Word. Transform me daily as I behold You and let Christ be seen in me. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESION

As I behold the Word, I am changed. I reflect Christ in my thoughts, my character, and my actions.



DAY

WALKING IN GOD'S LOVE

Scriptures: John 13:34–35; 1 Corinthians 13:1–7

God doesn't only call us to walk by faith; He also commands us to walk in love. Scripture reminds us that "faith works by love," meaning our faith is ineffective without a heart rooted in God's love.

Love is the greatest proof of spiritual maturity. It shapes our responses, deepens our relationships, and empowers us to forgive even when forgiveness feels undeserved. To walk in love is to rise above offense, bitterness, and self-centeredness. It is choosing Christ's way over ego, pride, or retaliation.

Love does not weaken us; it strengthens our spirit, purifies our thoughts, and reflects God to the world around us. When we choose love daily, we choose freedom. We choose peace. We choose God.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

God wants us to love others the way He loves us, kindly, gently, and with a big heart. When we forgive and share, we show God's love, and we make Jesus proud.

REFLECTION

Who must I intentionally love, forgive, or treat with kindness this week?

PRAYER

Father, fill my heart with Your love. Teach me to respond like Jesus with patience, compassion, and forgiveness. Help me love others the way You love me. In Jesus name. Amen.

CONFESSION

I walk in love with grace and understanding. My heart is free from offense.

I choose love in thought, in word, and in action.



SPIRITUAL Maturity & BOLDNESS IN PROCLAIMING CHRIST

Scriptures: Ephesians 4:13, 2 Timothy 1:7-8

piritual maturity is the intentional journey of becoming more like Christ, growing in understanding, obedience, and Christlike character. It is seen in stability, consistency, and the way we respond under pressure.

Boldness is the Spirit-given courage to stand for Christ without fear. It is speaking truth with conviction, living the Gospel openly, and refusing to shrink back. You carry His light; therefore, your life speaks even before your words do.

Maturity and boldness go hand in hand. When you know who you are in Christ, you cannot be silent. You stand, speak, love, and live like Jesus confidently, not timidly.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

God wants us to be brave and not afraid to talk about Him to our friends. You are God's light, so be bold to talk about him.

REFLECTION

Where do I need to grow in spiritual consistency and boldness?

This week, speak boldly, live boldly, and step forward without fear. God has not given you the spirit of timidity, but of power.

PRAYER

Lord, strengthen my walk with You. Make me bold to stand for Christ, speak Your truth, and reflect You everywhere I go. In Jesus name. Amen.

CONFESSION

I am spiritually mature and bold in Christ; I walk in understanding, obedience, and courage, speaking and living the truth of the Gospel without fear, reflecting Jesus confidently in every area of my life.



THE FREEDOM OF FORGIVENESS

Scriptures: Ephesians 4:31–32; Matthew 6:14–15

Forgiveness frees you more than the one who wronged you. It lifts the weight from your heart, restores inner peace, and makes room for joy again. To forgive is to open the door for healing, reconnection, and emotional release.

Unforgiveness is a prison, but forgiveness is liberation. It clears the mind, softens the spirit, and aligns us with God's heart. Letting go is not weakness; it is strength expressed through love and led by the Holy Spirit.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

When you forgive, you let go of the hurt and anger, and God fills your heart with peace. Holding anger only makes us sad, but forgiveness brings joy. Let's always choose to forgive, just like Jesus forgives us.

REFLECTION

What hurt do I need to let go of so I can step fully into peace and freedom?

PRAYER

Father, help me forgive freely and heal deeply. Fill my heart with Your peace and teach me to let go. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSION

I choose forgiveness. I release every hurt.
My heart is healed, whole, and filled with
God's peace.



STOP DOUBTING

Scriptures: Mark 11:23–24; James 1:6

The Spirit of God spoke through James: "But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering." The only cure for doubt is faith rooted in God's Word.

Doubt whispers limitations, but faith declares possibilities. You silence doubt by filling your mind and heart with God's promises, choosing to believe what He has spoken over you. Every scripture you meditate on becomes louder than your fears.

Shift your focus from what could go wrong to what God can do. Faith begins when you tell doubt, "You no longer have a voice here."

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Sometimes we feel scared, but we should always remember God's promises. Tell fear to go away and speak God's Word with confidence. God wants your heart full of faith, not worries.

REFLECTION

What fear or doubt must I confront with God's promises today?

PRAYER

Lord, strengthen my heart with faith and silence every doubt within me. I choose to trust You completely. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSION

I silence every voice of doubt with the Word of God. My heart believes, my mouth speaks, and my faith prevails.

DAY

BUILT TO STAND

Scripture: Matthew 7:24–27

esus taught that true stability comes not only from hearing His words, but from obeying them. The wise man built on a rock; he listened and acted. The foolish man built on sand; he heard but did nothing.

You are built to endure. Storms do not destroy what is anchored in Christ; they reveal its strength. When Jesus is your foundation, winds may blow, pressures may rise, and challenges may come, but you will stand. Obedience is the cement that keeps your life rooted, steady, and unshaken.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

When we listen to God and do what He says, we become strong like a house built on a rock. Even when hard things happen, God helps us stand and not fall.

REFLECTION

Am I building my life on obedience or convenience?

PRAYER

Lord Jesus, be my foundation. Teach me not only to hear Your Word but to obey it. Strengthen me to stand through every storm, anchored in You. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSION

My life is built on Christ, the solid Rock. I hear His Word, I obey His Word, and I will stand. I am unshaken, rooted, and built to last.

BREAKING SPIRITUAL AND SATANIC STRONGHOLDS

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 10:4–5

Spiritual strongholds are arguments, thoughts, and belief systems that oppose the knowledge of God. Goodnews is that every stronghold can be pulled down through the authority of Christ and the power of His Word.

This is spiritual warfare, and our weapons aren't natural; no sword, no fist, no human effort can win this battle. The Word of God, faith, and the authority of Christ are our weapons. Paul teaches us to cast down imaginations, to challenge lies, and bring every thought into obedience to Christ.

The battleground is the mind. If Satan keeps you in the realm of reasoning, he will win, but when you stand in the realm of faith, you overcome every time. Victory begins when truth replaces lies, and the Word becomes louder than every argument.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Sometimes wrong thoughts try to make us scared or confused, but God's Word is stronger than every bad thought. When we say what God says, those wrong thoughts are defeated.

REFLECTION

What belief, fear, lie, or thought pattern do I need to bring under the obedience of Christ today?

PRAYER

Lord Jesus, by Your authority and by Your Word, I pull down every stronghold in my mind. Replace lies with truth, fear with faith, and confusion with clarity. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESION

I cast down imaginations and reasonings. If the thought doesn't line up with God's word, I reject it.



OVERCOMING TEMPTATION

Scriptures: 1 Corinthians 10:13, James 4:7

Temptation itself is not sin; it is a test. Jesus was tempted, yet without sin. Temptation becomes sin only when we yield to it. God promises that no temptation is beyond our strength in Him, and He always provides a way of escape.

Our victory is found in submission and resistance. The Word says, "Submit yourselves to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you" (James 4:7 NIV). When temptation comes, don't negotiate, don't entertain, resist. Your worst enemy is the flesh.

Use the Word, pray, flee where necessary, and rely on the strength of the Spirit. You are not powerless. God equips His own to overcome.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Temptation is when you feel like doing something you know is wrong, but God gives you the strength not to do it. You should always pray and ask God to help you make the right choice.

REFLECTION

Which area of temptation do I need to bring under God's authority? Am I resisting or accommodating?

PRAYER

Lord, strengthen me to overcome temptation. Help me to submit fully to You, resist the enemy, and choose righteousness daily. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSION

I am strong in the Lord. I resist every temptation and walk in victory. Sin has no hold on me. I choose obedience, purity, and strength in Christ.



TRIUMPHING OVER FEAR

Numbers 14:9, Isaiah 41:10

Joshua and Caleb stood out among the twelve spies, not because the land was without giants, but because they believed God was greater than every giant. They didn't deny reality; they simply chose a higher truth: "We are well able, for the Lord is with us."

Fear looks at obstacles. Faith looks at God.

And God says: "Do not fear, for I am with you, I will strengthen you and uphold you with My righteous right hand" (Isaiah 41:10).

Fear paralyses, faith empowers. When God is with you, you can move forward boldly, even when circumstances seem overwhelming. Refuse to speak doubt. Don't confess fear. Speak faith, speak God's promise, speak victory.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Fear tries to make us feel small, but God makes us brave. Just like Joshua and Caleb, speak God's Word and remember He holds your hand. With God, you are strong and fearless.

REFLECTION

Where in my life am I still leaning on what I see rather than what God has said? What action of faith can I take today as a sign of trust?

PRAYER

What fear have I been confessing or agreeing with? What promise of God can I declare instead?

CONFESION

I refuse to fear, for the Lord is with me; His strength upholds me, His promises empower me, and I move forward boldly, triumphing over every obstacle with faith and courage.



HOW TO STOP COVETOUSNESS

Scriptures: Colossians 3:5,1 Timothy 6:6

Covetousness places something other than God at the centre of your heart, turning it into an idol. It feeds comparison, dissatisfaction, and restlessness. True freedom comes through contentment, trusting God's timing, provision, and plan for your life.

The Word reminds us: "But godliness with contentment is great gain" (1 Timothy 6:6). When your heart rests in God, you stop comparing, stop longing for what others have, and embrace the blessing of what He has given you.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Being content means being happy with what God has given you. We don't need to compare ourselves to others because God loves us and gives us what is best.

REFLECTION

What areas of my heart have I given to covetousness? How can I cultivate contentment and trust in God today?

PRAYER

Lord, help me to find satisfaction in You alone. Teach me to trust Your timing and provision, and to reject every form of covetousness. Fill me with gratitude and contentment. In Jesus name. Amen.

CONFESSION

I refuse covetousness. My heart is centred on God. I am content, grateful, and trust in His perfect provision for my life.



SLAYING GIANTS

Scripture: 2 Samuel 21:15–22

Many of us think that only David killed a giant Goliath. But the Bible shows us there were many giant slayers. After David defeated Goliath, 2 Samuel 21:15-22 tells how his men, like Abishai, Sibbecai, and Elhanan, also killed giants. David had trained them; he wasn't alone in the fight.

Leadership works the same way. If you are the only one facing every challenge, you will eventually grow weary, and your mission suffers. True leadership builds others to rise and fight alongside you. The strength of a leader is seen in those who can continue the mission when the leader is tired.

Remember, the giants you refuse to confront today, fear, doubt, or limitations, can defeat you tomorrow. Goodnews is that every giant falls when you stand in the authority of God's Word and Spirit.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Giants are big problems that seem scary, but with God, we can defeat anything. David and his friends were giant slayers because God helped them.

REFLECTION

What giant are you meant to slay in your life or ministry? Are you building others to stand with you, or are you carrying the burden alone?

PRAYER

Lord, give me the courage to face the giants in my life. Help me raise others to stand strong, so together we advance Your Kingdom. In Jesus name, Amen.

CONFESSİON

I face every giant in my life with courage and faith; I stand in the authority of God's Word and Spirit, defeating fear, doubt, and every limitation, while raising others to fight alongside me for victory.

STRETCH INTO DESTINY

Scripture: 2 Samuel 21:15–22

Stepping into destiny is rarely comfortable. The major things God prepares for you often require stretching spiritually, emotionally, and even physically. In God's kingdom, growth is usually born through pressure, discipline, and intentional effort, not ease. Even nature shows this: nothing improves by itself. According to the law of entropy, things left on their own decline, not rise. Destiny requires focus, endurance, and commitment.

Jesus showed us this truth. In Luke 12:50, He spoke of the "baptism" He needed to undergo to fulfill His purpose. Just like Jesus, we stretch into destiny through obedience, prayer, sacrifice, and consistency. The book of Hebrews reminds us to run with endurance. Comfort does not birth greatness. Purpose requires stretching.

When you pray, even when tired, stay disciplined, or choose what pleases God instead of what is easy, you are stretching into who God has called you to be.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Stretching into destiny means doing things that help you grow, even when they feel hard.

REFLECTION

Where is God asking me to stretch? Am I avoiding discomfort that is shaping me for my next level?

PRAYER

Father, help me embrace the stretch required for my destiny. In Jesus name, Amen.


CONFESION


