ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: *Matthew 9:17 (NKJV) "Nor do they put new wine into old wineskins, lest the wineskins break, the wine spill, and the wineskins be ruined. But they put new wine into new wineskins, and both are preserved."*

Have you ever felt stuck in a rut, like you're not making progress or fulfilling your purpose? It's time to break free from those old patterns and unlock new potentials! In Matthew 9:17, Jesus says, "Neither do people pour new wine into old wineskins. If they do, the skins will burst; the wine will run out and the wineskins will be ruined. No, they pour new wine into new wineskins, and both are preserved."

For God did not give us a spirit of fear, but [He has given us a spirit] of power and of love and of sound judgment and personal discipline [abilities that result in a calm, well-balanced mind and self-control]."*

As we journey through life, it's easy to get caught up in the hustle and bustle and lose sight of our purpose. We may start out with enthusiasm and passion, but as time goes on, we can find ourselves feeling drained and disconnected from our goals. That's why it's so important to sustain the fire within us.

In 2 Timothy 1:6-7, Paul writes, "For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of fear, but of power and love and self-control."

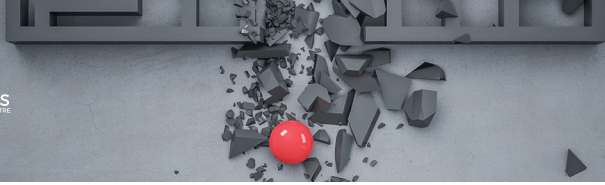

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BEYOND THE BOUNDARIES: THE COURAGE TO CHALLENGE THE STATUS QUO

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE. *Matthew 14:22-33 (NKJV) "Now in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, 'It is a ghost!' And they cried out for fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, 'Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid.' And Peter answered Him and said, 'Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water.' And He said, 'Come.' And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, 'Lord, save me!' And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, 'O you of little faith, why did you doubt?' And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, 'Truly You are the Son of God.'"*

As we journey through life, it's easy to get comfortable with the status quo and play it safe. We settle into routines, surround ourselves with familiar people and places, and avoid taking risks. But what if God is calling you to something more? What if He's inviting you to challenge the status quo and step out in faith?

In Matthew 14:22-33, Jesus challenged the disciples to come to Him on the water, beyond the boundaries of what was considered safe and possible. Peter, initially hesitant, took a step of faith and began walking on the water towards Jesus. But when he took his eyes off Jesus and focused on the waves, he started to sink.

We're often like Peter, hesitant to take that first step beyond the boundaries. We're afraid of the unknown, afraid of failure, afraid of what others might think. But Jesus is calling us to be brave, to trust Him, and to take that first step.

When we challenge the status quo, we open ourselves up to new possibilities, new experiences, and new growth. We begin to see that God is bigger than our small, comfortable worlds. We begin to see that He's worthy of our trust and our faith.

So, what are the boundaries that you're being called to challenge? Is it a fear that's holding you back? A doubt that's crept in? A comfort zone that's become too small?

Whatever it is, know that God is calling you to be brave, to trust Him, and to take that first step beyond the boundaries.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

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SEASONED OPPORTUNITIES: LEVERAGING TIME AND CIRCUMSTANCE FOR SUCCESS

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 (KJV) *"To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven: A time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted; A time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; A time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; A time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; A time to get, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away; A time to rend, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; A time to love, and a time to hate; a time of war, and a time of peace."*

Life is full of different seasons and circumstances that can either hinder or help us. But what if we could leverage these seasoned opportunities to achieve success? In Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, we read about the different seasons of life and how God has a purpose for each one.

Other times, we might feel like we're in a season of action, like when we get to decorate our cake with frosting and sprinkles! That's when we get to take bold steps and make things happen.

But no matter what season we're in, God is always with us and wants to help us make the most of every opportunity.

Verse: "There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under the heavens."
- Ecclesiastes 3:1

Repeat it with me: "There is a time for everything and a season for every activity under the heavens."

You are a chef, and God is your cookbook for success!

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: Luke 15:17-20 (NKJV) *"But when he came to himself, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you, and I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Make me like one of your hired servants.'"* And he arose and came to his father. But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him."

Sometimes, life can feel like a puzzle with missing pieces. We may feel broken, scattered, and disorganized. But God is the master puzzle-solver! He can take the pieces of our lives and assemble them into a beautiful work of art.

In Luke 15:11-32, Jesus tells the parable of the prodigal son, who represents the scattered and broken pieces of our lives. The father in the parable, who represents God, welcomes the son back with open arms and begins the gathering process.

The father doesn't scold or reject the son, but instead, he celebrates his return and starts the process of rebuilding and restoration. He takes the broken pieces of the son's life and begins to assemble them into a beautiful work of art.

That's what God wants to do with us! He wants to take the broken pieces of our lives and assemble them into a masterpiece. But we must be willing to surrender those pieces to Him and trust Him to assemble them into something beautiful.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Let's say you have a puzzle with missing pieces. You can't see the whole picture, but God can! He can take the pieces of our lives and make them into something beautiful.

Sometimes, we might feel like we're missing pieces in our lives, like we're not whole. But God can take those missing pieces and make us whole again!

CONFESSION

God is gathering the pieces of my life and rebuilding me into a beautiful work of art. No longer will I feel broken and scattered.

PERSONAL APPLICATIONS

Take a few minutes to pray and ask God to gather the pieces of your life and rebuild you.

Write down your thoughts and reflections from today's study.

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: Acts 2:42-47 (NKJV) *“And they continued steadfastly in the apostles’ doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers. Then fear came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. Now all who believed were together, and had all things in common, and sold their possessions and goods, and divided them among all, as anyone had need. So, continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved.”*

Have you ever felt like you’re just a small part of a big world, and that your actions don’t really make a difference? But what if I told you that’s not true? What if I told you that your small circle of influence can have a big impact?

In Acts 2:42-47, we see the early church gathering in small circles, sharing meals and learning from each other. These small circles of believers had a big impact on their community and the world. ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 (NIV) *“Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.”*

As we journey through life, we often find ourselves entangled in a web of complexities and challenges. Our perceptions can become clouded by our own biases, experiences, and limitations. However, God’s love invites us to see the world through a different lens, a lens of unconditional acceptance, compassion, and grace.

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MASTERING YOUR DOMAIN: THE POWER OF SELF-CONTROL

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: Galatians 5:22-23 (NKJV) *"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such there is no law."*

The concept of self-control is multifaceted and complex, encompassing various cognitive, emotional, and behavioral processes. In the context of biblical teachings, self-control is considered a fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23), essential for living a life that honors God. The Proverbial saying, "A man without self-control is like a city broken into and left without walls" (Proverbs 25:28), highlights the critical importance of self-control in maintaining personal integrity and protecting oneself from harmful influences.

To master our domain, we must first recognize the inherent weaknesses and vulnerabilities that reside within us, acknowledging the inherent sinfulness of our human nature. Then, we can begin to develop the skills necessary to regulate our thoughts, emotions, and actions, aligning them with God's will and purposes.

The apostle Paul's exhortation to the Corinthians, "I discipline my body and bring it under strict control, so that, after I have preached to others, I will not be disqualified" (1 Corinthians 9:27), serves as a powerful reminder of the necessity of self-control in achieving spiritual maturity and effectiveness.

Furthermore, the biblical account of Joseph's life (Genesis 39) provides a remarkable example of self-control in action. Despite facing immense temptation and adversity, Joseph remained steadfast in his commitment to God, demonstrating the power of self-control in overcoming even the most daunting challenges.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

In the Bible, it says, "God did not give us a spirit of fear, but of power and love and self-control." (2 Timothy 1:7)

When we have self-control, we can choose to do what's right even when it's hard. Just like how Jesus chose to obey God even when it was hard for Him. He wants us to be like Him and have self-control too!

Let's say you want a cookie, but you know you're not supposed to have one before dinner. You can choose to wait until dinnertime, even if it's hard. That's self-control too, and it's what God wants us to do!

Having self-control is like wearing a superhero cape. You get to choose how you act and react, and you can make good choices even when it's hard. And, when we make good choices, God is happy with us!

So, how can you practice self-control

- **You can start by paying attention to your thoughts and feelings.**
- **When you feel angry or upset, take a deep breath and count to 10 before you react.**
- **You can also practice sharing with others, taking turns, and using good manners.**

And always remember to pray and ask God for help when you need it!

Let's commit to practicing self-control this week, just like how Jesus did. We can do it!

CONFESSION

I no longer struggle with self-control. And my flesh no longer dictates my actions.

I submit to God's control in my life and develop the self-control necessary to live a life that honors Him.

I renounce the excuses and limitations that have held me back and embrace the power of the Holy Spirit.

PERSONAL APPLICATIONS

Take a few minutes to reflect on your own life and identify areas where you struggle with self-control.

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STILL WATERS: AN ASSURANCE THROUGH THE STORM

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: *Psalm 23:1-3 (NKJV) "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters. He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake."*

The Psalms have long been a source of and guidance for believers navigating life's tumultuous waters. Psalm 23, in particular, offers a powerful reminder of God's presence and provision in our lives. "The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul." (Psalm 23:1-3)

In these verses, we find an assurance that God is our Shepherd, who leads us to still waters, even in the midst of chaos. These still waters represent peace, calmness, and serenity - all qualities that are available to us through Christ. Yet, as we journey through life, we often find ourselves confronting storms that threaten to upend our sense of peace and security.

It is in these moments that we must draw upon the wisdom of the Psalms and remember that God is our rock, our refuge, and our savior. He will lead us through the stormy waters and bring us to a place of peace and tranquility.

As we reflect on our own lives, we may find ourselves recalling times when God led us through difficult circumstances. We may remember moments of uncertainty and fear, but also moments of divine intervention and guidance. It is in these memories that we find the assurance that God is always with us, even in the midst of life's storms.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Do you ever feel scared or worried when things get tough? Maybe you're feeling that way right now. But here's the thing: God is always with you, even when things seem stormy!

CONFESSION

God is my Shepherd and He leads me to still waters.

I renounce the lies of the enemy. I am not alone, and my hope is in Christ Jesus.

I trust in God's guidance and provision.

PERSONAL APPLICATIONS

Take a few minutes to reflect on your current circumstances and how they are making you feel.

Write down specific ways that God has led you through difficult times in the past.

Share your struggles and commitments with a friend or accountability partner.

Remember how we talked about God being our Shepherd? Well, a Shepherd helps his sheep find food and water, and keeps them safe from harm. And that's exactly what God does for us!

In Psalm 23, it says, "He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul." That means God will help us find peace and calm, even when things are crazy!

So, what can you do when you're feeling stormy inside?

- **First, take a deep breath and remember that God is with you.**
- **Then, talk to Him about how you're feeling. You can say something like, "God, I'm feeling really scared right now. Please help me feel better!"**

And guess what? God will answer your prayer! He might not make the storm go away, but He'll be right there with you, helping you through it. And when it's all over, you'll be stronger and wiser, just like a sheep who's learned to trust their Shepherd!

Let's practice finding our still waters today. Take a few minutes to draw a picture of yourself in a peaceful place, like a green pasture or a quiet beach. Then, write a short prayer asking God to help you feel calm and peaceful, no matter what's going on.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

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UNWAVERING DEDICATION: THE MARK OF FAITHFULNESS

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: Mark 12:30 (NKJV) *“And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.” This is the first commandment.*”

In the midst of a world that is increasingly fragmented and distracted, the call to an unwavering dedication to God is a radical and countercultural imperative. Mark 12:30 reminds us that we are to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. This kind of dedication is not simply a feeling or an emotion, but a deliberate choice to prioritize our relationship with God above all else.

As we reflect on our own lives, we may recognize areas where our dedication to God has wavered. Perhaps we have allowed the demands of work or family to crowd out our time with Him. Maybe we have permitted the allurements of social media or entertainment to distract us from our pursuit of Him. Or possibly we have simply grown complacent in our faith if our past commitments and experiences suffice for the present moment.

From Abraham’s willingness to sacrifice his son Isaac, to Esther’s courage in the face of certain death, to the apostle Paul’s unrelenting passion for the gospel, we see that dedication to God is not a part-time endeavor, but a full-time commitment.

So, what does this kind of dedication look like in our own lives? It means prioritizing our time with God, seeking Him above all else, and being willing to surrender our desires and ambitions to His purposes. It means being faithful in the little things, even when no one is watching, and being willing to take risks for the sake of the gospel. And it means being steadfast in our commitment to God, even when the world around us is shaking.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Do you know what it means to love God with all your heart? It means we love Him more than anything else in the world!

How can we show our love for God?

- **By reading our Bibles.**
- **By praying to Him.**
- **By singing songs to Him.**

Imagine you have a best friend, and you want to spend time with them all the time. That’s how we should feel about God! We should want to talk to Him, listen to Him, and be with Him all the time.

But sometimes, we get distracted and forget to love God with all our hearts. We might start to love other things more, like our toys or our friends. That’s okay! We can always come back to God and say sorry. He loves us no matter what!

So, let’s make a choice today to love God with all our hearts. Let’s read our Bibles, pray, and sing songs to Him. Let’s tell Him how much we love Him!

CONFESSION

I no longer allow my dedication to God to waver, and I repent of my complacency and distraction.

I love God with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength, and I remain faithful to Him no matter what.

I renounce the idols of my heart and the distractions of my mind, and I surrender myself fully to God’s presence and purpose.

PERSONAL APPLICATIONS

Take a few minutes to reflect on your current level of dedication to God.

Write down specific areas where you need to recommit yourself to Him.

Share your commitments with a friend or accountability partner.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- In what areas of your life has your dedication to God wavered?
- How have you allowed complacency or distraction to creep into your relationship with God?
- What steps can you take today to recommit yourself to unwavering dedication to God?



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GENTLE GRACE: THE BEAUTY AND STRENGTH OF KINDNESS

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: *Philippians 4:5 (NKJV)* "Let your gentleness be known to all men. The Lord is at hand."

In a world that often prioritizes strength and boldness, the virtue of gentleness can seem like a relic of a bygone era. Yet, in the eyes of God, gentleness is a powerful and beautiful trait that holds the potential to transform lives and communities.

The apostle Paul writes in Philippians 4:5, "Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near." This exhortation to gentleness is not a call to weakness, but rather a call to strength, the strength to choose compassion, empathy, and kindness in the face of adversity.

Imagine you are holding a small ball, and you throw it at your friend. They catch it and throw it back to you. That's kind of like what happens when we are kind to someone. We throw them a "ball" of kindness, and they catch it and throw it back to us!

So, let's make a choice today to be kind to someone. We can start a chain reaction of kindness and make the world a happier place!

Write a short story about a time when someone showed you kindness. How did it make you feel?

Remember, kindness is like a superpower that can change the world! Let's use our kindness superpower today!

CONFESSION

I commit to showing gentleness to others from today henceforth.

I choose to use my strength with care and compassion.

I desist from using harsh words and impulsive reactions to hurt others.

PERSONAL APPLICATIONS

Take a few minutes to reflect on your interactions with others.

Write down specific ways you can show gentleness in your relationships.

Show your commitments with a friend or accountability partner.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- How has your gentleness impacted someone else's life?
- In what ways can you choose to show gentleness today?
- How can you use your strength to uplift and support others?



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INSTRUMENTS OF IMPACT: SEEING GOD'S PURPOSE UNFOLD THROUGH YOU

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: 2 Timothy 2:15 (NKJV) *"Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."*

As believers, we are called to be instruments of impact for God's kingdom. We are to be vessels that He uses to bring hope, healing, and restoration to a broken world. But what does it mean to be an instrument of impact? And how do we become one?

To be an instrument of impact means to be a vessel that God can use to achieve His purposes. It means being willing to be shaped, molded, and transformed by Him so that we can be used to make a meaningful difference in the lives of others.

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HEAVEN'S RICHES: THE INCORRUPTIBLE REWARDS OF FAITHFUL SERVICE

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: *Matthew 6:19-20 (NKJV) "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal. But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal."*

In Matthew 6:19-20, Jesus teaches us to prioritize eternal investments over temporal ones. He warns us against storing up treasures on earth, where they are susceptible to corruption, theft, and loss. Instead, He encourages us to store up treasures in heaven, where they will endure forever.

This teaching is a call to reevaluate our priorities and values. We are often tempted to focus on accumulating wealth, status, and power, which are fleeting and unreliable. But Jesus invites us to invest in the eternal and the divine, to prioritize the things that will bring us joy and fulfillment in the life to come.

We can invest in the lives of those around us, sharing the love and grace of Christ with a hurting world. We can also cultivate a heart of worship, offering our praise and adoration to the Father.

As we invest in eternity, we will begin to experience the incorruptible rewards of faithful service. We will taste the joy and fulfillment that comes from living for something greater than ourselves. And when we finally stand before the throne of God, we will be welcomed as faithful servants, our treasures in heaven shining like stars in the firmament.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Do you know what it means to store up treasures in heaven? It means doing things that make God happy and that will last forever!

Imagine you have a special box where you keep all your favorite toys and treasures. But one day, you realize that the box is full of holes and your treasures are falling out!

That's kind of like what happens when we store up treasures on earth. They can get lost, broken, or taken away. But when we store treasures in heaven, they are safe and will last forever!

So, how can we store treasures in heaven?

- **We can start by being kind to others and doing things that make God happy.**
- **We can share our toys and treats with others.**
- **We can even sing songs and pray to God!**

When we do these things, we are storing treasures in heaven that will last forever! And when we get to heaven, we will be so happy to see all the treasures we have stored up!

Remember, storing treasures in heaven is like filling up a special box with love and kindness. Let's keep filling up our boxes and making God happy!

CONFESSION

I prioritize heavenly things over the things of the earth.

I store up treasures in heaven, not on earth.

I renounce any selfish desires that have hindered me from investing in eternity.

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UNCOVERING FRESH SPRINGS: DIGGING NEW WELLS OF OPPORTUNITY

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: Jeremiah 2:13 (NKJV) *“For My people have committed two evils: They have forsaken Me, the fountain of living waters, And hewn themselves cisterns—broken cisterns that can hold no water.”*

As we navigate the complexities of life, it's easy to become mired in stagnation and complacency. We often find ourselves relying on familiar routines and comfort zones, rather than venturing forth into the unknown. But God beckons us to do more. He invites us to dig deeper, to uncover fresh springs of purpose and meaning.

In Jeremiah 2:13, the prophet laments that God's people have “forsaken [Him], the fountain of living waters, and hewn out cisterns for themselves, broken cisterns that can hold no water.” This passage serves as a poignant reminder that our attempts to find satisfaction and fulfillment outside of God are ultimately futile.

We try to quench our thirst with broken cisterns – things that promise satisfaction but ultimately cannot deliver. We chase after success, status, and possessions, only to find that they leave us feeling empty and unfulfilled. We may even try to find meaning in our accomplishments and strengths, but these too will ultimately prove insufficient.

But God offers us a different path. He invites us to drink from the fountain of living waters, to uncover fresh springs of purpose and meaning. This requires us to renounce our reliance on broken cisterns and instead, dig deep into the wellspring of God's presence.

As we do so, we will find that our thirst is quenched, and our lives are transformed. We will discover that Jesus is the source of all true satisfaction and fulfillment. We will find that our lives are overflowing with purpose and meaning

And that we are living a life that is truly alive.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Imagine you're on a treasure hunt, and you're digging for treasure. You might find some cool rocks or shells, but eventually, you'll hit something hard. That's kind of like what happens when we try to find happiness in things that aren't God. We might find some temporary happiness, but eventually, we'll hit a wall.

But when we dig into God's Word, we'll find the real treasure! We'll find happiness, peace, and love. And the best part is, this treasure never runs out!

Here are some ways we can dig into God's Word:

- **Read our Bibles every day.**
- **Talk to God and listen to what He says.**
- **Ask Him questions and seek His advice.**
- **Trust Him and follow Him, even when things get tough.**

When we dig into God's Word, we'll find that He is our treasure! He is the one who loves us, cares for us, and wants the best for us. And He is the one who will help us through tough times and has given us eternal life.

So, let's decide to dig into God's Word every day. Let's ask Him to help us find the treasure that only He can give us. And let's remember that He is our treasure, and He will never leave us.

- What does it mean to drink from the “fountain of living waters” and find satisfaction in Jesus alone?



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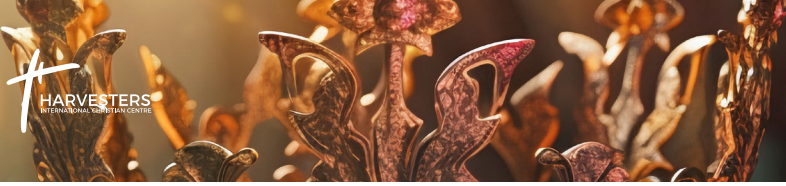
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THE KING AND HIS KINGDOM

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: Psalm 103:19 (ESV) *"The Lord has established his throne in the heavens, and his kingdom rules over all."*

God's throne is established in the heavens and His kingdom rules over all, including our lives. This serves as a reminder for us to submit to His rule and reign in our lives, and to recognize His authority as the King of Kings.

As we journey through life, we are constantly faced with choices that determine the trajectory of our lives. One of the most significant choices we can make is who we will serve as our king. Will we choose the King of Kings, Jesus Christ, or will we opt for a lesser ruler?

In 1 Samuel 8, the people of Israel demanded a king to rule over them, despite Samuel's warnings that a king would lead them away from God. This decision marked a turning point in Israel's history, as they began to rely more on human leadership than on God's guidance.

However, when we choose to follow Jesus as our king, we are submitting to a ruler who is perfect in wisdom, justice, and love. He is the King of Kings, who has conquered sin and death and reigns over all creation.

But what does it mean to submit to Jesus as our king? It means that we recognize His authority over our lives and choose to follow Him. It means that we surrender our desires and ambitions to His will. And it means that we trust Him to lead us and guide us, even when the path ahead is uncertain.

The consequences of choosing a lesser ruler than Jesus are severe.

When we reject God's rule and try to reign ourselves, we open ourselves up to sin, rebellion, and ultimately, destruction.

On the other hand, when we submit to Jesus as our king, we experience the blessings of His kingdom. We receive eternal life, forgiveness of sins, and the gift of the Holy Spirit. We are also empowered to live a life that honors God and brings glory to His name.

SAY TO YOUR KIDS

Do you know who the King of Kings is? It's Jesus! And He wants to be the king of our lives too.

Just like in the story of Saul and David, we must choose who we want to be our king. And if we choose Jesus, He will help us follow God's ways.

But what does it mean to have Jesus as our king?

- **It means that we listen to Him and do what He says.**
- **It means that we trust Him and follow Him, even when things get hard.**
- **It means that we love Him and want to be with Him forever!**

Who do you want to be your king? Jesus is the best king ever! He loves us so much and wants us to be happy. Let's choose Him to be our king today!

Activity:

- **Draw a picture of Jesus as your king.**
- **Write a short story about what it would be like to have Jesus as your king.**
- **Sing a song or recite a poem about Jesus being your king.**

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- What does it mean to submit to the King of Kings?

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THE NEXT LEAP: STEPPING UP WITH A NEW MOVE

ANCHOR SCRIPTURE: 2 Timothy 1:7 (ESV) *“For God did not give us a spirit of fear, but of power and love and self-control.”*

As we journey through life, we inevitably come to crossroads where we must make crucial decisions that will shape our future. These moments require courage, faith, and a willingness to take risks. In 2 Samuel 5, David faced such a moment when he had to decide whether to take the next leap and lead his people to victory over the Philistines.

David’s story teaches us that taking the next leap is not just about taking a decision; it’s about trusting God to lead us to victory. It’s about recognizing that we are not alone and that God is always with us, empowering us with His Spirit.

- **You are strong! You can handle whatever comes your way.**

CONFESSION

I am no longer hesitant to take the next leap in my life.

PERSONAL APPLICATIONS

Write down the next leap that God is calling you to take.
Plan to take that leap and share it with a friend or accountability partner.
Take the first step today, and trust God to lead you to victory.

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

- What is the next leap that God is calling you to take?
- What is holding you back from taking that leap?
- How can you trust God to lead you to victory in this next step?
